#### **WCPT Executive Committee**

In the past eighteen months since the European Region General Meeting, the WCPT Executive Committee has met on three occasions, most recently in November 2009. In addition, there have been a number of meetings using skype. The opinions of member organisations have been sought on a number of policy documents including accreditation/recognition of entry-level programmes and regulation and as a result of feedback received; these documents will be revised and re-circulated to MO's.
